AJRH's Editor in Chief elected to the United States National Academy of Medicine



The Editor in Chief of the African Journal of Reproductive Health (AJRH) has been elected into the United States National Academy of Medicine (NAM). The announcement was made on October 21, 2024 by the Academy. He was one of 10 international members elected from outside the United States, and one of two scholars from Africa so elected.

In their citation, the NAM listed the reason for the award as follows: “for expertise in reproductive health and leading large national and international research in interventional and implementation research for preventing maternal mortality with impact on policies and programming in African countries. He is committed to gender quality, ethics, and equity in global and African settings.”

All staff and editors of the African Journal of Reproductive Health, the Women’s Health and Action Research Centre (WHARC), and the African Centre of Excellence in Reproductive Health Innovation (CERHI) at the University of Benin, Nigeria, all of which he founded and have led over the years congratulate him for this groundbreaking award.
